The importance of place At Leeds Federated, we know home is much more than bricks and mortar. Home is about belonging, community and place.

As a landlord, we *have to* look after your home by carrying out repairs and supporting tenancies etc. But we *want to* do more.

We want to learn more about the place you live so we can improve neighbourhoods and help build stronger communities that offer what you need now, and in the future.

What we're already doing

During 2024/25 we developed 'Neighbourhood Plans' together with customers living in the neighbourhoods we support across Leeds, Kirklees, Wakefield and North Yorkshire.

The Plans include feedback from customers about what they'd like to see in future, as well as data about the local area.

So far, we've used the Plans to

- learn more about the people and communities in the areas we serve
- set up community action days to improve the environment and help people get to know each other
- try out different ways of meeting people where they live

What we want to do next

1. We'll continue to develop the Neighbouhood Plans and look at how the data can help us improve our services. We want to:

- offer more tailored opportunities to link in with our Money Matters team
- collaborate with local partners to reduce anti-social behaviour, particularly where there are hotspots
- understand more about customer wants and needs so we can make sure people can get the most out of our services
- hear from more customers this could be through our Neighbourhood
 Officers, or at local events and activities or through online options
- connect customers with more opportunities to find employment or training
- share more updates with customers about what's happening locally
